

Daviness County Commissioners
Minutes
Special Meeting
June 12, 2013

The Daviness County Commissioners met in a special meeting Wednesday, June 12, 2013 after a Joint Executive Session of the Daviness County Commissioners and the Daviness County Council, in the Commissioners Room of the Daviness County Courthouse with Vice-President Michael Taylor and Secretary Larry Wilson present. President Anthony Wichman was not in attendance.

Vice-President Michael Taylor called the meeting to order.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

BENNINGTON LEVEE AGREEMENT

Vice-President Michael Taylor asked if there were any comments or questions from the public in attendance, to which no one spoke. PUBLIC REQUEST REGARDING AVONDALE AVE

Also the drop off from the newly paved Edwardsport Road is quite a substantial drop and needs attention as well. Commissioner Michael Taylor stated that he will check on the status of the location to see if this is a private drive issue concerning Avondale Ave. but assured Ms. Allison that the drop off from the new paving will be taken care of by the Highway Department.
