Re: Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Effectiveness Measures

The purpose of the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) program is to provide funding for a system of emergency preparedness for the protection of life and property from all hazards. The intent of the training and exercise requirements outlined in the 2012 EMPG grant guidance is to ensure that the EMPG program ensures the development of a professional emergency management workforce that is ready to respond to any emergency. Accordingly, the prescribed training and exercise requirements, including the Professional Development Series, apply to all state and local personnel whose salaries are either fully or partially funded by the EMPG program.

In accordance with the Federal grant guidance for EMPG program, the Indiana Department of Homeland Security must validate that all EMPG personnel are compliant with these requirements. Please submit this document to grants@dhs.in.gov no later than July 31, 2013.

As required under the 2012 EMPG program and the 2012 EMPG program Grant Agreements between the County and the Indiana Department of Homeland Security, EMPG Program funded personnel are required to participate in at least three (3) HSEEP-compliant exercises and must have completed the following training courses between July 1, 2012 and June 30, 2013:

- National Incident Management System (NIMS) Training
 - IS 100; IS 200; IS 700; and IS 800
- FEMA Professional Development Series
 - IS 120; IS 230; IS 235; IS 240; IS 241; IS 242; and IS 244


IDHS has incorporated the federal standard into the assessment document, as noted in standard A6, so it maintains credit for both state "points" and federal compliance.

Emergency Management Performance Grant program-funded personnel that do not complete these requirements will not be eligible for salary reimbursement under the 2013 EMPG salary reimbursement program through IDHS. In future years, this training and exercise requirement will be tracked via the iGMS upload feature.




